

**1. Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi inaugurated a new terminal building at Namo Airport in Daman.**

**2. Ladakh Lieutenant Governor (LG) Vinai Kumar Saxena laid the foundation for Ladakh's first model border village at Chumur.**

**3. Commerce & Industry Minister Piyush Goyal launched the Bhavya Portal.**

- Portal is under the Bhavya Bharat Audyogik Vikas Yojana.
- Objective: Develop 100 world-class industrial parks (each ranging from 100 to 1,000 acres) across India.
- Total outlay: ₹33,660 crore over six years.
- Government provides ₹1 crore per acre for internal infrastructure.

**4. PM Ujjwala Yojana – Subsidized LPG Refill Cap Revised**

- The Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) provides subsidized Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) to economically weaker households.
- Government capped subsidized LPG refills from 9 per year to 4 per year.
- Subsidy remains at ₹300 per cylinder.

**5. West Bengal Joins PM Jan Arogya Yojana (Ayushman Bharat)**

- The Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) under Ayushman Bharat was originally launched in 2018 in Ranchi.
- Provides ₹5 lakh per family per year health coverage to poor and vulnerable families.
- West Bengal became the 36th State/Union Territory in India to implement PMJAY (Ayushman Bharat).

**6. India's 12-Year Health Transformation – Key Milestones**

- Overall Coverage: Government health schemes covered 44 crore families.
- Ayushman Bharat: Issued 44.14 crore Ayushman cards; facilitated 12.03 crore hospitalizations.
- Infrastructure: Over 1.86 lakh Primary Health Care Centers (Ayushman Arogya Mandirs) opened as first points of contact for rural populations.
- Telemedicine: More than 47 crore telemedicine consultations conducted.
- Digital Health: Government allocated ₹64,000 crore to the Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission.
- Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission: Introduced a 14-digit ABHA ID to store and track digital medical histories.
- Safe Motherhood: Covered 7.47 crore women.
- Mission Indradhanush: Vaccinated 5.46 crore children and 1.32 crore pregnant women.
- Tuberculosis (TB): 3.78 lakh 'Ni-kshay Mitras' adopted TB patients for nutrition and medicine support.
- India targets elimination of malaria and other communicable diseases by 2027.

**7. Operation Delta Hunt – Gujarat Cracks Down on Illegal Bangladeshi Nationals**

- Gujarat State Police launched Operation Delta Hunt, a state-wide crackdown.
- Objective: Identify and deport illegal Bangladeshi nationals.

**8. Meghalaya Border Fencing Protests**

- Villagers in Lyngkhong fear that fences built slightly inside the 'Zero Line' will place their village outside the fence, severely restricting access to the Indian mainland.

**9. New Immigration & Foreigners Rules 2026**

- Visa registrations extended within a 180-day window.
- New online appeal mechanism created: appeals against immigration orders must be filed within 30 days.
- Removed the 30-day rule to inform officers of a child's birth in India if at least one parent is an Indian citizen.

**10. Record Wheat Procurement for 2026-27 Rabi Season**

- Government wheat procurement for 2026-27 Rabi marketing season hit a 5-year high of 35 million tonnes (MT).
- Exceeds the set target of 34.5 MT.
- MSP: ₹2,425 per quintal (an increase of ₹150).
- Domestic wheat production: 120.65 million tonnes.

**11. Kerala Launches 'Hawk' – India's First Digitized Wildlife Offense Management System**

- Kerala (also written as Keralam) launched 'Hawk' (Hostile Activity Watch Kernel).
- India's first fully digitized and judiciary-integrated wildlife offense management system.

### **12. PM Modi Becomes India's Longest Continuously Serving Democratic Prime Minister**

- Previously, Jawaharlal Nehru held the record for the longest consecutive tenure as Prime Minister of India.
- On June 10, 2026, PM Narendra Modi completed 4,399 consecutive days in office.
- Surpassed Jawaharlal Nehru's record of 4,398 days.
- PM Modi became India's longest continuously serving democratically elected Prime Minister.

### **13. Key National Appointments and Administrative Decisions**

- Tarun Kapoor's tenure as Advisor to the Prime Minister extended by one year to June 2027.
- UP CM Yogi Adityanath and Union Minister Jitendra Singh inaugurated India's 8th Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC) in Lucknow.
- Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav and Delhi CM Rekha Gupta inaugurated 18 Namoo Oxygen Parks in Delhi under the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' campaign (targeting 15 lakh trees in 2026 to curb pollution).
- Tamil Nadu introduced a 24/7 online document registration system.
- The GeM (Government e-Marketplace) portal celebrated its incorporation day in 2026.
- Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) extended free Aadhaar document updates until June 2027.
- Dr. Jitendra Singh attended the 150th celebration of the Indian Association for the Cultivation of Science (IACS) in Kolkata, where C.V. Raman discovered the 'Raman Effect'.

### **14. India's Real GDP Growth Rises to 7.7% for FY25-26**

- India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth is tracked by the National Statistical Office (NSO).
- NSO and SBI's research report 'Ecowrap' confirmed India's Real GDP growth rate at 7.7% for FY25-26.
- Q4 FY25-26 growth accelerated to 7.8%.

### **15. RBI's 61st Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) Meeting – June 2026**

- Meeting: 61st MPC Meeting held on June 3-5, 2026.
- RBI maintained a 'neutral stance'.
- Repo Rate: Unchanged at 5.25%.
- Standing Deposit Facility (SDF): 5.00%.
- Marginal Standing Facility (MSF): 5.50%.
- Real GDP Growth Projection for FY27: 6.6%.
- Consumer Price Index (CPI) Inflation Projection: 5.1%.

### **16. India's Current Account Deficit (CAD) for FY25-26**

- RBI data showed Current Account Deficit (CAD) for FY25-26 widened to \$25.2 billion (0.6% of GDP), up from \$22.9 billion in FY24-25.
- Q4 FY25-26: Recorded a Current Account Surplus of \$7.1 billion (0.7% of GDP)

### **17. Currency Circulation & BHIM Transactions – FY26 Update**

- ₹500 banknote circulation grew by 11.2% in FY26, reaching 7.05 lakh crore pieces.
- ₹500 notes represent 85% of total currency value and 41.2% by volume.
- Detection of fake ₹500 notes increased by 20% in 2026.
- ₹2000 notes: Remain withdrawn.
- BHIM (Bharat Interface for Money) payment interface transactions surged by 301% in FY26.

### **18. WPI Base Year Revised; New Producer Price Index (PPI) Launched**

- The Office of the Economic Adviser revised the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) base year from 2011-12 to 2022-23.
- A new Producer Price Index (PPI) — tracking output, input, and services — was launched on June 15.
- WPI previously excluded the services sector, which accounts for 55% of India's GDP.

### **19. RBI Rural Consumer Confidence Survey Findings**

- The RBI's Rural Consumer Confidence Survey covered 8,813 respondents.
- Revealed weakened current economic, inflation, and income sentiments.

- Future Expectations Index: Remains optimistic at 119.3.

### **20. FPI Reforms – Capital Gains Tax Removed on Government Securities**

- Government eliminated long-term and short-term capital gains tax on government securities for Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs), effective April 1, 2026.
- Previously: 12.5% (long-term) and 30% (short-term).
- Fully Accessible Route (FAR) expanded to include 50-, 30-, and 40-year government securities and sovereign green bonds, removing investment limits.
- Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) limits allow up to 10% equity investment in listed companies (overall 24% limit).

### **21. RBI Proposes 1-Hour Cooling Period for High-Value Digital Payments**

- RBI proposed a 1-hour cooling period for digital transactions above ₹10,000.
- Such transactions account for 45% of fraud by volume and 98.5% by value.

### **22. India is the world's largest silver consumer.**

### **23. RBI Penalties, Appointments & Banking Moves**

- RBI fined Canara Bank ₹41.8 lakh for central KYC (Know Your Customer) registry failures and incorrect dormant account classifications.
- Swaminathan Janakiraman reappointed as RBI Deputy Governor for 2 years, effective June 2026.
- Gunir Singh appointed RBI Executive Director to head the Payment and Settlement System.
- IFSCA licensed Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) to set up an International Banking Unit (IBU) at GIFT City.
- Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA) launched 'Star NPS', a digital onboarding platform for agents/brokers (age 18-85).
- PFRDA also introduced a regulatory sandbox framework.

### **24. State Bank of India (SBI) paid an ₹8,813 crore dividend cheque to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman for FY25-26**

### **25. Elon Musk topped Forbes Billionaires with \$834 billion; the top 10 richest collectively hold \$2.9 trillion.**

### **26. India Receives 4th S-400 Triumf Missile Squadron from Russia**

- India signed a deal for five squadrons of S-400 Triumf surface-to-air missile system with Russia in 2018.
- India received the 4th squadron of the Russian S-400 Triumf surface-to-air missile system.
- Designated as 'Sudarshan' in the Indian Air Force (IAF).
- Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) is developing an indigenous counterpart, Project Kusha.

### **27. DRDO Successfully Tests Rudram-2 Air-to-Surface Missile**

- DRDO successfully test-fired the Rudram-2 air-to-surface missile.
- Range: 300-350 km.
- Test location: Chandipur, Odisha.

### **28. India-US Army-to-Army Staff Talks (29th Edition)**

- The 29th India-US Army-to-Army Staff Talks were held in Hawaii.
- India led by: Lt Gen Rajiv Ghai. USA led by: Lt Gen Joel Vowell (US Army Pacific).
- Discussed the TRUST (Transforming the Relationship Utilizing Strategic Technologies) initiative, launched in February 2025.
- TRUST aims to: improve supply chains and grant access to advanced US space, energy, and defense technology.

### **29. The first-ever Joint Defense Committee meeting between India and Zimbabwe was held in New Delhi.**

- Chaired by Amitabh Prasad (India) and Aaron Daniel (Zimbabwe).

### **30. Key Defense Appointments**

- Air Marshal Ashutosh Dixit appointed new Vice Chief of Air Staff for the IAF, replacing Nageshwar Kapoor.
- General N, S. Raja Subramani is the 3rd Chief of Defence Staff (CDS).
- Major Prabhat received the Indian Army Brier Brooks Award.

**31. SIPRI 2026 Report – Global Nuclear Weapons & India's Military Expenditure**

- Global nuclear weapons inventory: 12,187.
- Country-wise: Russia – 5,459 (maximum), USA – 5,177, China – 620, followed by France and UK.
- India's nuclear warheads: Increased to 190 (from 180); India operates under a 'No First Use' policy.
- Pakistan: Holds 170 nuclear warheads.
- India ranks 5th globally in military expenditure, accounting for 3.2% of global military spending with 8.9% growth.
- Source: Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) 2026 Report.

**32. The Indian government warned citizens to leave Iran, Israel, and Lebanon immediately.**

**33. National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) organized the 2nd technical meeting of the BRICS Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) Working Group.**

- Held in Puri, Odisha.
- India holds the 2026 BRICS chairmanship.

**34. South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol nominated Han Myeong-sook (also known as Hemmong Suk or 'Singing Suk') as South Korea's 2nd female Prime Minister.**

- Former CEO of Naver (referred to as the 'Google of Korea').

**35. Major Natural Disasters – Earthquake in Philippines & Typhoon in Japan**

- A 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck Manila, Philippines, triggering tsunami warnings.
- Tsunami effects expected in Indonesia and Thailand.
- Typhoon Jangmi hit Miyazaki, Japan (Kyushu island), damaging approximately 17,000 homes.
- Japan uses wooden houses due to its position on the volatile 'Ring of Fire'.

**36. After a 9-year gap, South Korea and Japan conducted a joint maritime Search and Rescue Exercise (SAREX).**

- Location: Jeju Island.

**37. OpenAI's ChatGPT crossed 1 billion global monthly active users (MAUs), becoming the fastest app in history to do so (surpassing Google Maps and TikTok).**

- Anthropic's Claude reached 56 million MAUs, with 640% Year-on-Year (YoY) growth.

**38. Anthropic expanded access to its specialized cybersecurity AI model called 'Mythos' under Project Glasswing.**

**39. India and Nepal signed an MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) through Digital India Bhashini Division and Kathmandu University to develop an AI-powered multilingual platform.**

- Bhashini supports 36 Indian text languages, 23 voice languages, and 35 international languages.
- Bhashini unveiled the Vyoma Innovation Challenge with a prize of ₹80 lakh for multilingual AI voice solutions.

**40. Under the PM Setu Scheme (budget: ₹60,000 crore to upgrade 1,000 ITIs), ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel (AMNS) became the first approved company, setting up a research center in Andhra Pradesh.**

**41. India rolled out E20 fuel (20% ethanol blend) on April 1, 2026.**

**42. Government plans to implement E85 fuel (85% ethanol blend) in Delhi NCR, Mumbai, Pune, and Nagpur.**

- E85 costs ₹20 less than E20.

**43. India Becomes World's 2nd Largest Solar Growth Market; 3rd Largest Producer**

- International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA): India is the world's 2nd largest solar growth market in 2025, adding 37 GW, bypassing the US (trailing only China).
- Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) data positions India as the world's 3rd largest solar power producer (passing Japan).

**44. Italian luxury brand Prada and Axiom Space unveiled the Liquid Cooling and Ventilation Garment (LCVG) inner suit for astronauts.**

- Designed for NASA's Artemis IV lunar mission planned for 2028.

**45. India Wins 6th SAFF Women's Championship 2026**

- India previously won the South Asian Football Federation (SAFF) Women's Championship in 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016, and 2019.

- India ('Blue Tigresses'), captained by Sangita Basfore, won their 6th SAFF Women's Championship title (8th edition).
- Final: India defeated Bangladesh 3-1.
- Venue: Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Margao, Goa.
- Most Valuable Player (MVP): Sanfida Nong (India).
- Top Scorer: Aea Singh (India).
- Best Goalkeeper: Panthoi Chanu (India).
- Fair Play Award: Nepal. Pakistan did not participate.
- Manipuri star Grace Dangmei announced her international retirement post-victory.

### **46. India Wins Gold at Under-18 Asia Cup Hockey (Men & Women)**

- Men's: India won gold (their 3rd title) by defeating host Japan 4-1 in Kakamigahara.
- Hat-trick scorer: Ashish Purti. Captain: Ketan Kushwaha.
- Pakistan won bronze.
- Women's: India won bronze with a 3-0 victory over South Korea; China claimed gold.

### **47. French Open 2026 – Zverev & Andreeva Win Grand Slams**

- Tournament: French Open 2026 (125th Edition), held at Roland Garros on clay court.
- Men's Singles: Alexander Zverev (Germany) won his first Grand Slam by defeating Flavio Cobolli (Italy).
- Zverev became the first German man to win a Grand Slam since Boris Becker in 1996.
- Women's Singles: Mirra Andreeva (Russia), aged 19, won her first Grand Slam singles title, defeating Maja Chwalińska.
- Youngest women's Grand Slam winner since Monica Seles in 1992.
- Italian Open 2026: Jannik Sinner won the men's category.

### **48. R Praggnanandhaa Becomes First Indian to Win Norway Chess Tournament**

- R Praggnanandhaa broke records of past Indian grandmasters (including Viswanathan Anand) to become the first Indian ever to win the prestigious Norway Chess Tournament.

### **49. India's Boxing Achievements – World Rankings & Asian Championship**

- India ranks 3rd globally overall in the Top 10 Boxing Athletes and 2nd worldwide in women's boxing.
- Jaismine Lamboria: World No. 1 in the 57 kg category.
- Minakshi Huda: World No. 1 in the 48 kg category.
- India won 27 medals (including 9 gold) at the Asian Boxing Under-15 Championship.

### **50. Other Sports Updates**

- Weightlifting: The Asian Weightlifting Championship was held in Gujarat.
- Cricket: Rahul Dravid became the owner of the Dublin franchise in Europe's first ICC-approved T20 league.
- Sports Authority of India (SAI) signed an MoU with Japan's University of Tsukuba for sports science.
- David Beckham was awarded a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame ahead of the 2026 FIFA World Cup.
- Mount Everest saw a new single-day record of 274 summiting climbers. Kami Rita Sherpa climbed for a record 32nd time.

### **53. 'e-Jagriti' Consumer Portal Wins Silver at National e-Governance Awards**

- The 'e-Jagriti' consumer portal (launched January 1, 2025, by Department of Consumer Affairs) won the Silver Award at the National e-Governance Awards (Digital Transformation category).
- J&K Bank won the Gold Award at the Finacle India Connect 2026 event.

### **55. Obituary – Malayalam Actor Salim Kumar Passes Away**

- National Award-winning Malayalam actor Salim Kumar passed away at the age of 56 in Kochi, Kerala.

- Known for comedy and character roles.
- Previously won the National Film Award for Best Actor for the film 'Adaminte Makan Abu'
